[COLLECTORS' CORNER]

THE U.S.A. PUZZLE

Exploring the history of lighters in the U.S. is similar to working a giant puzzle. Discovering a new piece in the puzzle is very exciting.

There are the larger pieces, which are more readily available, such as Zippo and Ronson. But equally as important to complete our puzzle, are the smaller pieces.

Recently Bill Kim (OTLS Member) has been doing some of his own research and has discovered a company most of us didn't have much information on. In fact some of you may never have seen an Eveready Cigar Lighter. Bill forwarded his correspondence with Eveready Battery Company to your editor to share with the club.

After further correspondence, and telephone calls with Michael Mazva, Manager of Consumer Relations, a picture has started developing into a piece for our puzzle.

1898 was the beginning of American Eveready Company of St. Louis, Missouri. In 1914 American Eveready merged with National Carbide Company, to become Union Carbide. Eventually Ralston Purina bought the company and the name is presently Eveready Battery Company, Inc.

Of course we all have Eveready flashlights and batteries...but do you know about their lighters?


On May 29, 1894 a patent was issued to David Misell forming part of Letters Patent No. 520,445 for an ELECTRIC CIGAR-LIGHTER. You will note this patent was issued before American Eveready Company formed. Also the patent indicates Nathaniel S. Rosenau as assignor for the patent. Possibly David Misell sold his rights for the Patent to the American Eveready Company. Mazva indicated this is only an assumption since the company has no actual record of this transaction.

We do know from old catalogs belonging to the company, lighters were sold from 1903 to 1904. It appears after that date lighter production ceased. As well as the electric cigar lighters, the company sold 'flint wheel' lighters, which used gasoline. The catalogues indicate many of these flint type lighters were Serling Silver or Gold. However, some were also brass, nickel plated or enameled.


When Mazva was asked why the company called them 'cigar lighters', he replied "probably because cigars were so popular then.

Bill Kim and Michael Mazva have also provided pictures from 1903-1904 catalogs showing pictures of various lighters Eveready produced and sold. It appears after these dates, Eveready no longer produced any type lighters.




Xerox of an Eveready lighters from Bill Kim's personal collection.

Another enterprising member, Paul Rowan, just discovered a new Zippo fact. Looking through an old model car catalogue, Paul found a picture of a "ZIPPO CAR".

He proceeded to write to Zippo asking for information about this car.

Rudy Bickel, Assistant Advertising Manager, responded with the following: "There was indeed a full-sized Zippo lighter car. ...This car was driven from coast to coast, north & south in the U.S., and used in parades, store openings, etc."

Bickel added "The last recollection, we have placed it in Pittsburg, PA to be repaired. The cost was prohibitive, and we think it was scrapped."

Maybe OTLS should buy it??!!
