IN THE SPOTLIGHT....

THERE'S GOLD (LIGHTERS) IN THEM (BEVERLY) HILLS!

Do not be misled (or think you will be bored) when you hear June Berliner has only collected lighters for approximately 2 years. In this span of time June has acquired a "show piece" collection.

As a recent guest in the home of June & Robert Berliner, this writer never ceased to be entertained, astounded and awed. Nestled in the heart of Beverly Hills for 30 years, June and Robert have raised 3 children - Patricia, Jim & Paul. Now all grown, Jim has also added his lovely wife, Diane (another OTLS Member) and their 2 children David & Carolyn.

For many years June has been a collector of compacts. Along with this collection, she started acquiring cigarette cases. Berliner said "One day in an Art Deco Store I fell wild over some Art Deco lighters --- then I remembered my mother had given my Father a gorgeous Gold Dunhill Watch lighter in 1933, and she gave it to me a few years before she died. So I went to a smoking auction in England, bought a Dunhill Acquariam --- and a few others--I was hooked!)

Taking the grand tour thru June's collection, is a great experience. If you are looking for her oldest you would probably want to see the English Tinder Pistol (Iron & wood) with a candle holder, dating from between 1750 and 1800.

Berliner presented one Evans (lift arm type) as her most unusual. On the front of the lighter is a hologram of a man's face. He is wearing a Top Hat, Tuxedo and smoking a cigarette.

COLLECTORS' CORNER

1949 TOBACCO WORLD FEATURES McMURDO

Displaying pictures and describing manufacturing techniques was not unusual a few years ago. Today's ads for lighters (If you even see one) are seldom so picturesque.

Shown on page 5 is a full page ad which was featured in the October 1949 issue of the British magazine TOBACCO WORLD.

McMurdo Lighters fall under that category of "Hard to Find." And if found, you can't help but be attracted to the unusual style and mechanism.

Richard Ball (England) has researched this company and come up with the following facts. Ball says it appears the company originally was named British McMurdo Sterling Co., Ltd., having incorporated October 6, 1937. In June of 1940, the name of the company was changed to McMurdo Instrument Co., Ltd. Then again in January of 1963 the name was changed to McMax, Ltd.

Information as to why the name was changed isn't available. Although you could speculate possibly the company was sold one or more times.

We also do not know during what span of time this company actually manufactured lighters. With the exception of knowing from the ad the company was obviously producing lighters in 1949.

In the book by Stefano Bisconcini, he shows a copy of a Patent which appears to be a McMurdo. According to Bisconcini, this patent was submitted by a Harry Lakey on March 6, 1946, and is a patent of the table model.

However, in researching company records in England, Ball did not find Lakey mentioned as an officer or director of McMurdo. Possibly he invented the McMurdo lighter and sold the patent to the owners of McMurdo Instrument Company.

We do know McMurdo made table

lighters and pocket lighters. Although 3 models are all that have surfaced so far.

Of the two table models seen, Fig. A (photo) has a 'skin' covering and Fig. B (from collection of Judith Sanders) is gold metal, covering with a yellowish brown leather. According to one brochure Richard acquired, Fig A and B were "contructed of durable metal in various finishes" - it does not mention there also were different "coverings."

The second model of table lighter is taller and slimmer. Please refer to Fig. C. It is agreed by these writers this model was made later than Fig. A and B.


A breakdown of the McMurdo Table Lighter is shown in Fig. D. Note each lighter also had a spare flint container built into the bottom screw. The bottom screw is also much larger than usually found.

Where there appears to have been at least 2 tables lighters, these writers have only seen style of pocket model. However, the pocket model was made in at least 3 different sizes (see photo below of 2 sizes). The pocket version was a type of chrome and a smaller version of Fig. C.. One version in the collection of Richard Ball has a gold sheath around it.

Possibly you have a McMurdo in your collection and didn't realize the value or rarity of the lighter. Although there are many rare lighters, those from smaller companies, and where the lighters were not made in great quantities, may be more unique than those from a larger company.

It is hoped one member of OTLS can discover another version of the McMurdo Lighter to share with the other members in the future.
